- Opening up Public Sector Information:
 - Office of Fair Trading (“The Commercial Use of Public Information”)
 - Cabinet Office (“The Power of Information”)
 - Treasury (“Review of Trading Funds”)
- Using the new Statistics Act:
 - Statistics for the public good
 - Meeting users’ needs
 - Scope for sharing administrative data for statistical purposes
- Implementing the Treasury Committee Report recommendations:
 - Update estimates, inc. short-term migrants, and daytime populations
 - More use of government administrative files for statistical purposes
 - Create a definitive national address file for the 2011 Census
 - Progress towards a population register for statistical purposes

Opportunities, ...but Urgency?

- Government databases
 - The sheer range of sources & topics
 - Universal coverage (c.f. even Tesco)
 - Postcoded – for area statistics, & matching
 - Now (c.f. back to 2001, or awaiting 2011)
- How can more be made available more quickly?
- Cultural change
 - All sources: “Good” now (& then “Best” later)
 - Think of the value for decision makers
 - Experimental – & encourage users’ comments – giving metadata
 - Partial pointers to recent trends can be so valuable
 -& what does this mean for perfect “National Statistics”?
